CCS Scholarships

The Meaney Scholarship

The Meaney Scholarship is funded from a bequest to the school from the late Patrick Meaney Esq. He was a local businessman and farmer who bequeathed the proceeds from the sale of his book collection to the school. We are profoundly grateful for this extraordinary philanthropic gesture and we are deeply appreciative of the opportunity it will afford students to pursue

Godolphin Bursary

This bursary is open to all students at Cashel Community School who will sit the Leaving Certificate in June 2022. It will be awarded to a student who intends to continue full-time study at an institute of technology or university in Ireland, or at an equivalent institution overseas.

The recipient will receive a laptop computer along with €1,500 per year of third level study paid in two annual payments of €750 each.

It is a condition of the bursary award that recipients give a commitment to undertake a minimum of 100 hours of voluntary work per 12-month period for the duration of the bursary. Voluntary work can be undertaken with charities, community groups or sporting organisations. The 2019 winner of the Godolphin Scholarship was Emma Ryan

Young Scientists Winners 20/21

Congratulations to Megan Kirby and Ava Abbott on being awarded 3rd prize in the Senior Group Social and Behavioural section of the BT Young Scientists competition in January 2021.

The project titled, THE KNOCK ON EFFECT, was a statistical analysis of the relationship between head trauma and the onset of mental illness. The girls carried out a massive 1500-person survey through their social media platforms and analysed the data to create correlations, present their findings and make recommendations for future care of head trauma sufferers. The subject matter is now very topical with rugby and soccer players to show how they are suffering following head traumas in their sports. The girls plan to follow up and expand their study with an eye to entering next year's competition again.

Well done to the girls who have continued a nice trend for our school following on from our first place award in the same category last year.





YSI – Young Social Innovators of The Year 2020!

Category – Making our Community A Better Place Gold Award

This year the YSI team researched the misuse of accessible parking places by able bodied drivers. They were appalled at this ongoing issue locally and nationally. They worked closely with Ms Ryan to think more about solutions to this issue.

The students took the idea of a prototype deterrent device flagged by the Cashel Gold Star Initiative and brought it to action assisted by the Engineering Dept in the school . The students prepared their project presentation called a Speak Out and performed in front of judges in Kilkenny last March. The students learned they were one of nine schools nationally to partake in the virtual final sponsored by Virgin Media in October. It was here at this live event that the students discovered they were named the overall Young Social Innovators of the year taking home a beautiful John Rocha designed trophy and prize money of €2,000.

The school has a very proud history of YSI success in the school winning a bronze and two silver national awards previously. The YSI programme is an integral part of the TY programme in the school and promotes many skills every year including civic action, research, analysis, social innovation, critical thinking, project planning and communication skills.

1st Year...How it works





We are very aware of how dramatic a change it is for any student to transfer to a new school. **The transition from Primary to Secondary school** is a significant challenge in a child's life. As a school we enjoy excellent relations with our colleagues in our feeder primary schools. We try our best to meet with all of the primary school principals so that we can get a true flavour of the student intake to CCS.

We are also acutely aware of the **many varied needs** that pupils present with as they start in secondary school. We have a tailored Special Eduactional Needs (S.E.N) model that we feel really helps children and the various challenges they present with. We also help students whose first language is not English by offering an English As An Additional Language (EAL) programme.

All 1st years fully immerse themselves in the **10 option subjects** that we offer here in CCS. These are offered on a **½ year modular basis** so that all students can be very sure of the choices they make going into 2nd year.

1st Year...How it works

We operate **a week long induction** for all 1st years so that they really do settle in and familiarise themselves with our school and how it works. This happens in tandem with our 6th year 'Links' who are on hand to support and assist with your son/ daughter feeling safe, secure and happy with us here in CCS.

- Your son/daughter will be in a class group of no more than 24 thus very similar to their 6th class group size
- 1st year lockers are based in the front of the building thus giving the student space to adjust to life in CCS.
- Our guidance department and Chaplain regularly connect with your son/daughter just to see how things are going. This aids the sense of belonging and community
- Guidance related learning in the key areas of student managing their study times – 1st years use many assessment for learning techniques such as mind maps/ time lines etc
- Where possible SNA support is available to our most vulnerable students.

Home School Links

We believe very strongly that education must be based on close co-operation between parents and teachers. We have regular contact with parents through information evenings, parent teacher meetings, class masses and school reports.

By working in partnership we are ensuring that students reach their full potential so that they are prepared for life and are able to take their place in society.

Transition Year

Transition Year is an extra year at Senior Cycle which allows the student to mature as a person, develop a wide range of skills and experience the adult world of work.

Young Social Innovators (YSI)



Working in teams of five to 25, TY students identify a social issue of concern to them, explore it and come up with real actions and responses. YSI features regional and national events to which participants are invited. The programme is youth-led, team-based and action-focused.

Benefits of YSI

- Encourages and actively promotes the development of links between the school and local community
- Promotes a school ethos of care and holistic development of young people
- Promotes new opportunities for civic engagement amongst students.

TY Project

Once again this year all TY students are involved in an ongoing and formal Project.

The projects are in the following 7 areas: Art, Young Social Innovators. Young Scientist Competition, GAA Future Leaders Course, Media Studies, Journalism, Drama and Robotics.

Here are some examples from 2020/2021

- 1. The Art group are working on a collaborative Mural, which will depict their perspective on the Covid -19 pandemic.
- 2. The Young Social Innovators group is hoping to create a sensory garden space to enhance student wellbeing. The students will think about how to include the 5 senses into their garden plan. Their project will be entered into the Regional heats of the Young Social Innovators Competition, and from there, possibly, to the Grand Final, which takes place in Dublin, in May.
- 3. The Young Scientist group will work, during the year, on a series of Projects of interest to them, with a view to entering this prestigious Competition in January 2022.
- 4. The GAA Future Leaders Course is in its third year. It aims to cultivate Leadership and Coaching Skills within the students participating, with a view to them actively helping out, in leadership roles, with their local Clubs and beyond going forward.
- 5. In the Media Studies class the students gain an understanding of character, setting and plot, in action films. Exploring camera angles, sound effects and the stereotypes associated with video games will follow.
- 6. The Journalism course will enable students to learn all about newspapers and the writing, analysis, preparation and photography that is involved in putting a newspaper together.






Pastoral Care · All members of management and staff exercise a






