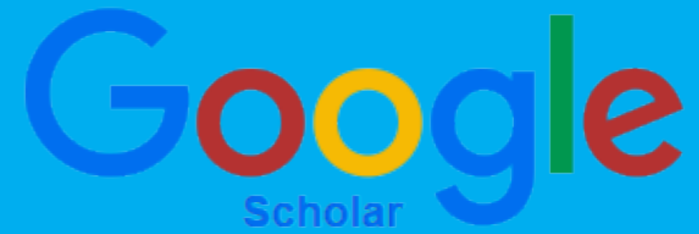

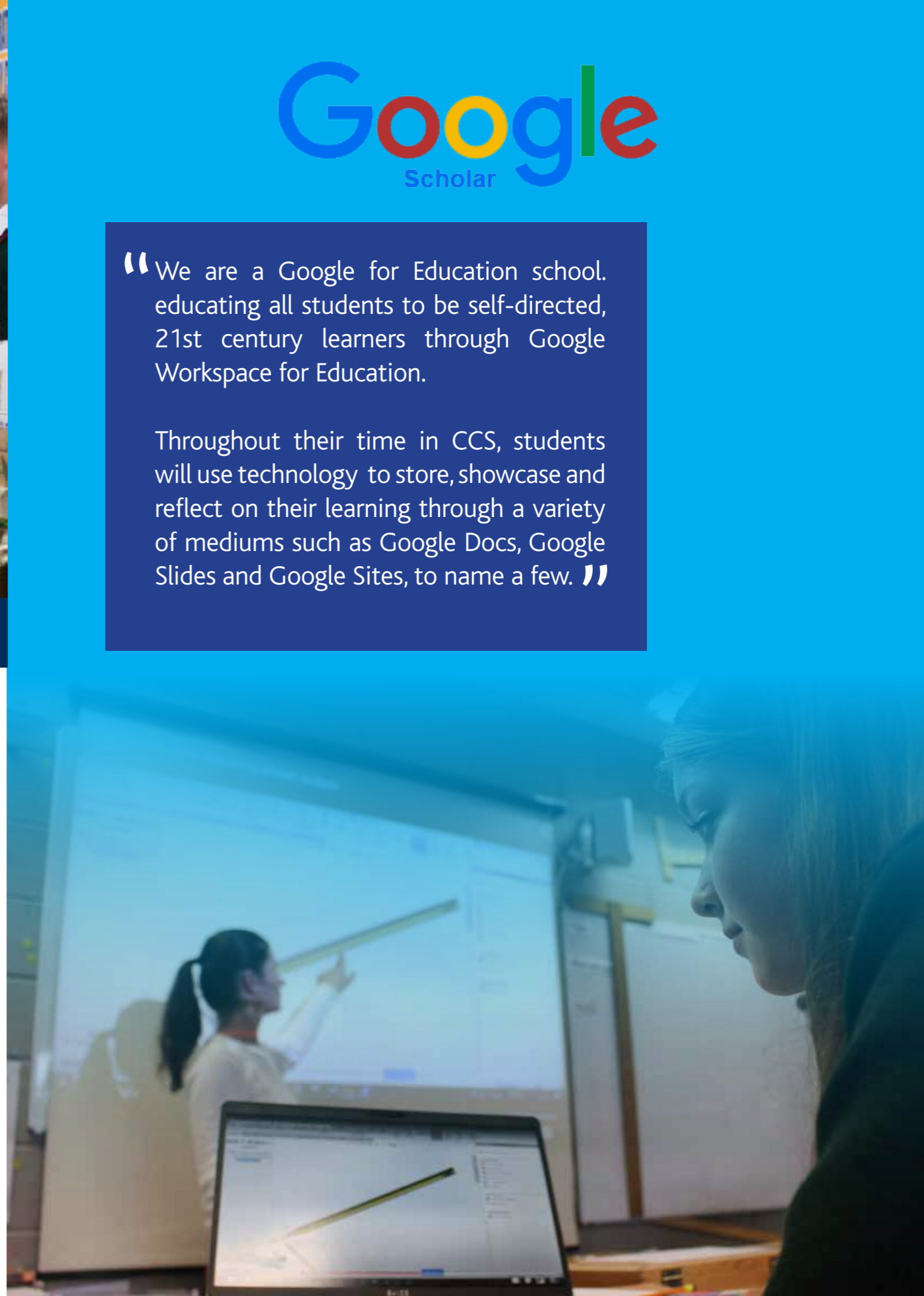
## Curriculum

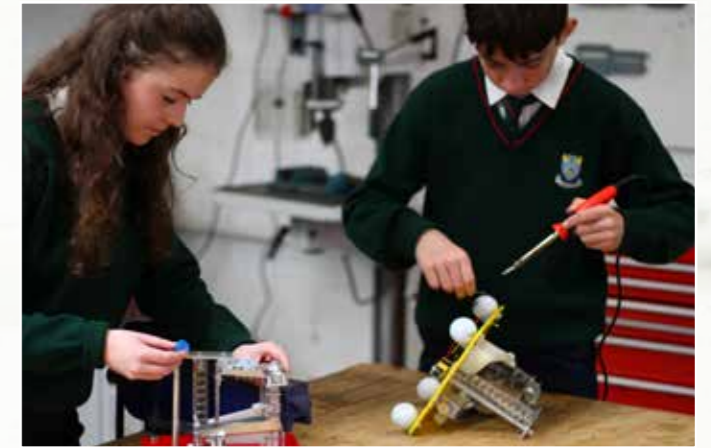

All incoming 1st year students will be asked to purchase a Chromebook.

This encourages students to use a nominated electronic device (Chromebook) to complement their studies and learning techniques in addition to online resources such as digital textbooks.

Cashel Community utilises the G Suite for Education which is now the Google Workspace for Education Fundamentals — this suite of programmes comprises easy-to-use tools that provide a flexible and secure foundation for learning, collaboration and communication.

## Student Council

The Student Council has been functioning in Cashel Community School since 1997. The Council provides a forum for students to express their opinions and enables them to play a partnership role with the staff, Parents' Association and Board of Management.

This ensures that the students play a positive role in our school's decision making process. A member of staff is responsible for liaising between Principal and Council. The Council meets on a regular basis and delegates report to their classes after every meeting.

The student council has been involved in organising various events such as the variety show and fundraising for local and national charities. Senior members co-ordinate the production of the 6th year Yearbook, the Class Mural and the Graduation night.



## Pastoral Care

- All members of management and staff exercise a caring role towards the students.
- Each class group is assigned a Class Tutor. This teacher regularly monitors the progress and welfare of each student. To assist with this there are scheduled pastoral care assemblies throughout the year.
- Each Year Head sees to the overall progress and welfare of his/her Year Group.
- The Career Guidance Counsellors and School Chaplain are always readily available to assist students who may need personal support.
- Students, of their own accord, can directly approach the Chaplain or Guidance Counsellors. In addition, parents/guardians, management and staff members may request support for a student. The Guidance Counsellors and Chaplain each have their own office where they meet with students individually.
- The School Chaplain gives students spiritual guidance.



# 1st Year... *How it works*



We are very aware of how dramatic a change it is for any student to transfer to a new school. The transition from Primary to Secondary school is a significant challenge in a child's life. As a school we enjoy excellent relations with our colleagues in our feeder primary schools. We try our best to meet with all of the primary school principals so that we can get a true flavour of the student intake to CCS.

We are also acutely aware of the many varied needs that pupils present with as they start in secondary school.

We have a tailored S.E.N model that we feel really helps children and the various challenges they present with. We also help students whose first language is not English by offering an EAL programme.

Remember all 1st years fully immerse themselves in the 10 option subjects that we offer here in CCS. These are offered on a modular basis so that all students can be very sure of the choices they make going into 2nd year.



We operate a week long induction for all 1st years so that they really do settle in and familiarise themselves with our school and how it works. This happens in tandem with our Senior Cycle Students 'Links Programme' who are on hand to support and assist with your son/ daughter feeling safe, secure and happy with us here in CCS.

- Your son / daughter will be in a class group of no more than 24.
- 1st year lockers are based in the front of the building giving the student space to adjust to life in CCS.
- Our guidance department and Chaplain regularly connect with your son/ daughter. This aids the sense of belonging and community
- Guidance related learning in the key areas of student managing their study times – 1st years use many assessment for learning techniques mind maps/ time lines etc
- We understand that students present with an array of educational needs and our SEN model is designed to address and support these.

## Home School Links

We believe very strongly that education must be based on close co-operation between parents and teachers. We have regular contact with parents through information evenings, parent teacher meetings, school reports and of course our Compass App.

By working in partnership we are ensuring that students reach their full potential so that they are prepared for life and are able to take their place in society.

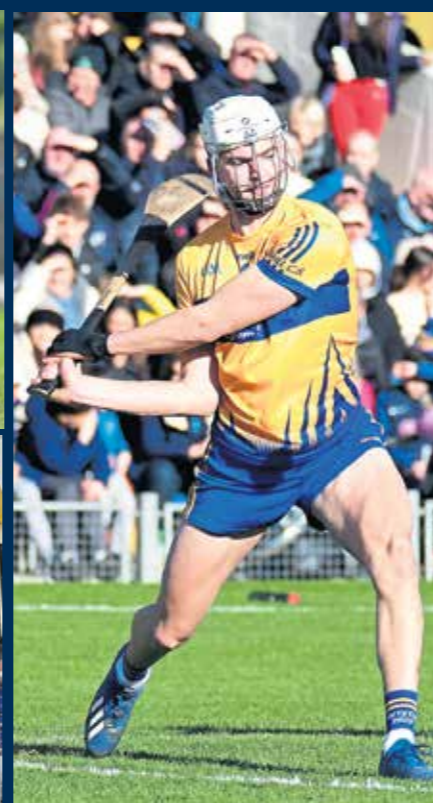
